#### OPENING MATERIAL

### ((if they are NOT PET OWNERS))

You don't have a pet? Oh. Hmm. You know they help you live longer. It's been proven. Take some literature. Read it over. There are some really wonderful cats out there. It's fun just to watch them. It's a meaningful experience. You feel different about life after watching a cat outside. I know I do.

## ((TO DOG OWNERS))

Oh dogs, okay, that's okay! I have nothing against dogs. I think they're fine. For some people - a lot of people. Do you go to dog parks? Do your dogs enjoy it? I bet they do. I bet it's something nice in their routines. I bet they get excited when you drive up and they know something is going to happen. They start wagging their tails? Timber, that's my cat, she doesn't wag but you can tell when she's excited. She loves being outside. She likes trees. Even a large bush will do. Do you want to see some picture?

((TO CAT OWNERS)) Oh a cat! Great! What's your cat's name? What do they look like? Do they like to chase things? Do you let them outdoors? Well - part of the design is fencing - the ideal cat park is for cats - it's a safe outdoor environment. There's fencing. And the trees are tall but not too tall. It's safe. When she was young, she just loved those trees. I'd bring a book outside, maybe some lemonade and just let her climb. I'd like to see her happy. She's beautiful. Seven years. Still very healthy. I take her out on a leash but there's no where safe for her to run.

((IF GUEST IS INTERESTED))

((From out of nowhere, a well dressed woman (Davis) appears. She has a briefcase.))

DAVIS ((to a guest)) Is he bothering you?

DAVIS Cat park? Sound expensive.

JARED The land is already there - it's just a few adjustments. It'll cost less than most things the city spends its money on.

(She smiles. Reads some literature. Jared keeps talking to guests. She listens.))

JARED Just imagine it. Different cats run together. Pouncing, Maybe there's catnip. Not too much. Just a little.

DAVIS Who's behind this?

JARED It's just me.

DAVIS A one man operation?

JARED So far. I've got some signatures. Oh, will you sign? I'm gathering signatures.
